Warm weather and nice rain have been happening once in a while in February and since Lent just began it seems that spring might be in the air. As I write this it is only the 1st of March. I imagine there will be some winter left to come but Spring is coming.

Each year this time of Lent before Easter is a time for us prepare to celebrate the Crucifixion and Resurrection of our Lord. Like Spring, Easter is not

here yet but it is coming. We are called to use this time of Lent for self-examination and reflection; for getting ready to once again rejoice in our Lord who died and was raised so we could have life eternal.

## News from Krislund

As previously reported, Krislund served just over 1,900 young people in 2016 through the traditional summer camp season using some very non-traditional outreach and programs. The other good news story about this multi-generational ministry is that use of the camp and conference center through the other 9 months of the year continues to expand. In fact, last year, Krislund hosted nearly 3,200 individuals that attended overnight retreats, day meetings, Amish gatherings or adventure experiences. This lesser known aspect of Krislund's activity is essential to the mission and economic well-being of the ministry. As we are part of a connectional church, it's helpful to think of and promote Krislund to others as more than a summer camp for young people. The facilities are comfortable and very conducive to all sorts of uses on a year-round basis so next time you have the opportunity, think of Krislund for your next family gathering, meeting or retreat!

Please note that registration is currently underway for the 2017 summer camp season. This year's theme is "Star Wars at Camp Krislund" and promises to be a great experience for all! Please help us recruit for summer by promoting the opportunity to young people whether they attend our church or any church for that matter. Additionally, the Presbytery of Donegal recently voted to engage Krislund to provide summer programming to Camp Donegal. Beginning this summer, Camp Donegal and Krislund Camp and Conference Center will enter a partnership for shared summer camp ministry. Krislund will provide the staff and program for a four-week summer camp season that will leverage the energy, creativity and vision that Gene Joiner and his team provide to a camp that has tremendous promise for the future.
