As March arrives, we begin the season of Lent. Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent, is March 6. Then it is a little over six weeks to Easter! The Christian church has always used the Lenten season as a time of reflection and study leading up to the most important week in history. That week begins on Palm Sunday, with Jesus' entry into Jerusalem, and goes through Maundy Thursday, with the celebration of the Last Supper, into Good Friday,
